Since 2014 he is also a Diplomate of the European Veterinary Dental College (Equine). Additionally to his vast practical experience in equine dentistry, he is the editor and co-author of the Textbook of Equine Dentistry (Lehrbuch der Zahnheilkunde beim Pferd) and a co-Founder of eMOHN-research group (equine **M**astication, **O**ral **H**ealth and **N**utrition). Today Carsten works at a large equine practice in Ottersberg, Germany, where he treats hundreds of equine dentistry patients every year.

Leena Karma is a Finnish veterinarian specializing in equine dentistry. She works at the Porvoo Equine Clinic she herself founded in 2010. Porvoo is one of the first clinics in Finland providing advanced equine veterinary dental services, including cavity restorations, endodontics, diastema and periodontal disease control as well as dental extractions. She also offers referral services in more complicated dental cases and is a lecturer for postgraduate veterinarians in equine dentistry. Leena obtained her degree in veterinary medicine from the Estonian University of Life Sciences in 1999 and therefore speaks fluent Estonian.
